HOLIDAY FOLK FAIR *INTERNATIONAL* TO ADD FOUR TO VOLUNTEER HALL OF FAME

MILWAUKEE, WI – Four long serving individuals will be added to the Holiday Folk Fair *International* Volunteer Hall of Fame during the 74th annual event, which will be held Fri., Nov. 17 – Sun., Nov. 19, 2017, at the State Fair Park Exposition Center at in West Allis, Wis.

The following people will be recognized during the event's opening ceremony at 5 p.m. on Fri., Nov. 17:

Pat and **Ray Ciocarelli** have been extensively involved with Swiss/Swiss American ethnic organizations and have served as Holiday Folk Fair *International* volunteers for more than 25 years. The former Director of the Swiss Turners, Ray coordinated the Swiss food booth at Holiday Folk Fair *International*. He currently serves as the Swiss American Society authorized representative. Pat has been a long-time coordinator of the cultural exhibit at Holiday Folk Fair *International* and currently serves as the Treasurer of the Swiss Ladies. As an active member of the cultural group for more than 40 years, Pat has served as vice president, coordinated cultural programs, and organized the *Edelweiss* newsletter. Presently, she helps manage the membership list.

Serbia native **Bob Milkovich** arrived in the United States at 26 and has been a Holiday Folk Fair *International* volunteer for more than 30 years. Milkovich served as the Artistic Director of Oplenac Serbian Folk Dance Group at Serbian St. Java from 1961 to 1968, and as the Artistic Director of Sumadija Serbian Folk Dance Ensemble between 1968 and 1988. He was also a member of Holiday Folk Fair *International's* executive committee and served as a chairman of several special programs. For his participation with Holiday Folk Fair *International*, Milkovich earned the International Institute of Wisconsin's World Citizen Award. Milkovich also was chairman of entertainment in Old Pabst Park from 1969 to the early 1990s, also serving as the group's first vice chairman and second vice chairman for two years each.

Jean Wroblewski is highly involved in the Polish community and has served as a Holiday Folk Fair *International* volunteer for more than 20 years. Since 1995, she has been an active member of Polanki, a Polish women's culture club in Milwaukee. Her involvement has allowed her to chair and co-chair events sponsored by Polanki, including the Holiday Folk Fair *International* food booth and marketplace, the Soup Festival, and the Pierogi Dinner. Additionally, she leads the sale of Polish folk art merchandise and Boleslawiec ceramics, the iconic pottery made in Poland, at the Holiday Folk Fair *International* marketplace, Polish Fest, Polish Center of Wisconsin, and other regional festivals and cultural events. Wroblewski is also a member of other Polish organizations, including the Polish Heritage Alliance, Inc. and the Polish Heritage Club of Wisconsin in Madison. She is also a Captain of the Civil Air Patrol (Auxiliary of the United States Air Force) WI Wing. Throughout her career at Veterans Health Administration, she took on leadership roles to support local and national events for veterans. Recently, she received the Wisconsin Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics Outstanding Dietician of the Year Award.

A program of the International Institute of Wisconsin, Holiday Folk Fair *International*, America's premiere multi-cultural festival, celebrates the heritage of the people living in southeastern Wisconsin. Admission at the gate will be \$12 for adults; \$8 for children ages 6 to 12; children under the age of five will be admitted at no charge. Those 62 and over will be admitted for \$10, and all military personnel with a military ID card will be admitted free.
